Abstract: This report provides annual updates to the data presented in the labour force chapter in the Statistics Canada publication 'Women in Canada 2000' which documents the major changes in the evolving status of women in Canada. Topics covered in this report include trends in employment; employment of women with children by age of youngest child; shifts in the occupational distribution of women; part-time work; and self-employment and unemployment rates.
