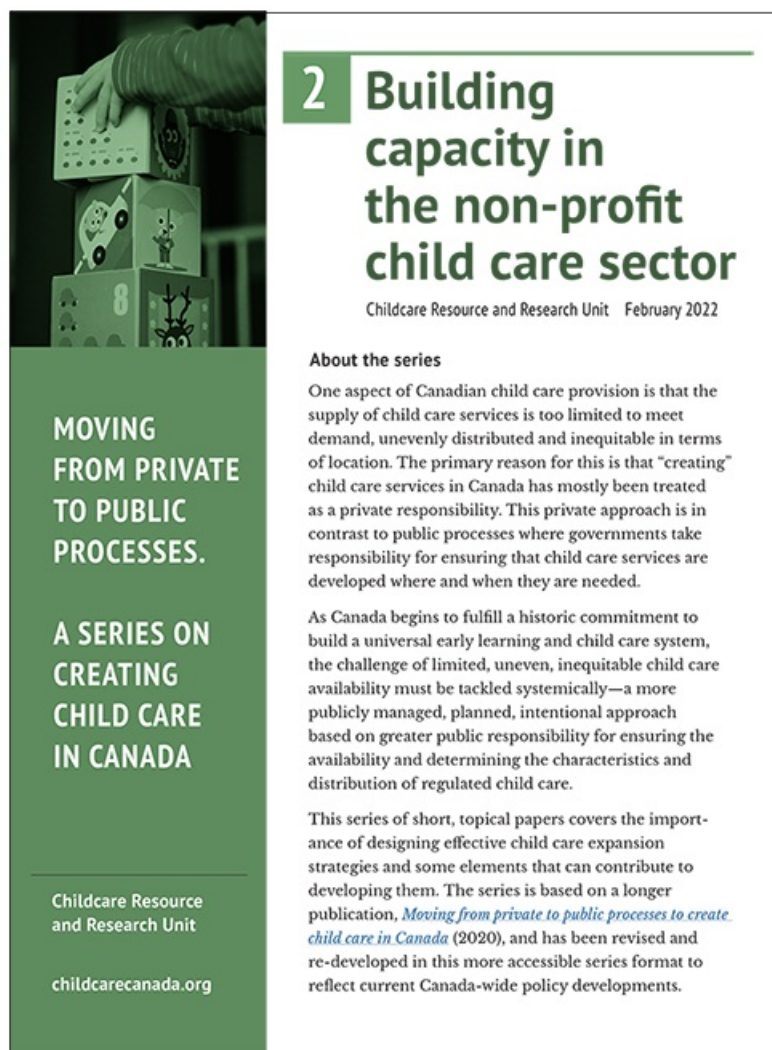

The non-profit child care sector's capacity to maintain or expand services has limitations that create barriers to building sufficient child care availability. But the reality is that without a publicly funded, more publicly managed child care system, even well-resourced voluntary non-profit services will struggle.
