### Purpose of this study:

3: To create knowledge exchange opportunities to enhance government, institutional, community and individual responses to the impact of COVID-19 on African/Black individuals, communities, front line health care workers and essential service workers in Canada and transnationally.

**Confidentiality:** Any information that is obtained in connection with this study and that can be identified with you will remain confidential and it will not be disclosed in a way that could identify you. Audio/video recordings will be stored securely and erased after being transcribed. Written versions of audio recordings will not include any identifying information that you might mention, for example, a name, an employer, etc. Audio recordings and transcripts will be kept with an ID number which cannot be traced back to participants name or any other identifying information.
