The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission found not-for-profits spent more on staff, had higher retention levels and more full-time rather than casual workers.

Following the 4 Corners investigation the government announced it would target operators that put "profit over quality" in a new enforcement scheme co-designed with industry.

The government said there was only a "small number" of operators doing the wrong thing.
